The next morning we all trekked to the HOF which was just a block away. Four floors of various sizes contained a lot of NASCAR history. The displays were interesting and well done. There were hands on areas where you could test your tire changing skills and well as driving skills. The driving was done via a computer screen. Before you were allowed to 'race', you had to go to 'practice' and 'qualifying', where you learned how to operate and control your car. There was even an instructor providing tips. Jim won

the qualifying by having the fastest lap of the 4 of us, Bob, Bob, George, and Jim. Then off to the cars after some more instruction. You get to sit in a car body (2 drivers per car but you do not see the other driver) with a display screen in front of you along with a speaker so you can hear your 'spotter'. Jim led for a lap or so until he got hit. I got hit right away and lost a lap.
